Miriam earned her bachelor's degree in anthropology from Wheaton College. She also holds a master's degree in journalism from Syracuse University and a doctorate in anthropology from Washington State University. She serves on boards for several ministry

organizations, including Christianity Today International and Christians for Biblical Equality.

Miriam is a member of University Presbyterian Church in Seattle, Wash. She is married to Michael Adeney and is the mother of Daniel, Joel and Michael.
